




Message by IMA President

Dear Colleagues,

Greetings from IMA Goa State!



The last three months of our tenure have been marked by the unfortunate Kolkata incident and the subsequent series of events, including a day of national OPD shutdown on 17/09/24, Supreme Court directives, and the formation of a national task force for the safety and security of healthcare professionals. This tragic event has brought to light the numerous challenges faced by healthcare professionals across India.

On the day of National OPD shutdown, we submitted a memorandum to Hon. Chief Minister Dr. Pramod Sawant, who assured us that all concerned issues would be addressed. He convened a joint meeting on 27/08/2024 with the IMA state team, along with the Health Minister, Dean of GMC, DHS Director, MS District Hospital, Chief Secretary, DGP, IGP, SP, DySP, and GARD President. The GARD President vividly presented the unsafe and sensitive areas at GMC, along with a series of demands for workplace safety (Code Violet, CCTV, armed personnel, police outpost, DRO, walkie-talkies, and more).

On behalf of IMA Goa State, Dr. Shailesh Kamat, Chairman of the Medicolegal Cell, delivered a detailed presentation on the Doctor-Police relationship for better healthcare. This included various issues such as violence against doctors, alleged medical negligence leading to such violence, loopholes in the existing Goa Medicare Act, relevant amendments in the Clinical Establishments Act, POCSO, and Quackery.

Some of the key demands put forward included amendments to the existing Goa Medicare Act, ensuring safety and security at the workplace, and an ordinance for extending the date for permanent registration (which has been agreed upon by Ganesh Chaturthi). These demands were agreed upon in principle.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Dr. Shailesh and Dr. Shekhar on behalf of IMA Goa State for their methodical approach in addressing these issues. A special thanks to Dr. Shekhar, who successfully managed to bring together all the top bureaucrats along with the CM and HM on one platform.

There is an order from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare to furnish details of the security status of hospitals with more than 100 beds. Some of our members with solo clinics, polyclinics, and small nursing homes have expressed concerns that this should not lead to stringent, mandatory security guidelines that might backfire. We will have to wait and watch what comes our way.

One event that is definitely coming our way is GIMACON 2024 on the 5th and 6th of October. We have just reached triple figures in registration. For those who have still not registered, we urge you to do so. In the future, it appears we may have to rely mainly on delegate fees to organize conferences, as many of the pharma companies we depend on for educational grants are currently hesitant due to stringent NMC guidelines.

Once again, I sincerely request all to register for GIMACON 2024.

See you all on the 5th and 6th of October for our annual IMA academic and cultural feast.

Incoming President's Message

Dear Members,



This is a proud moment for me as I am standing before you as the incoming president of Goa state branch of Indian Medical Association, the world's largest association of Medical fraternity. Again, I am representing the most vibrant branch-IMA Ponda branch which is known for its community work and bonding among the members. It is only a coincidence that this conference in which I am speaking as incoming president is being organized only 4 km away from my workplace and it is giving me a great feeling especially being a remote area. I appreciate the courage and vision of our Bicholim branch colleagues in organizing it here.

IMA is on the crossroads and unity of medical fraternity has become crucial. The recent happenings in Kolkata has proved this. If Indian Medical Association had not stood firmly for the heinous act of torture and rape of a doctor at her workplace, it could have been hushed up. But the resident doctors from all over the country and the Indian Medical Association stood firm and demanded justice. Acts of violence against doctors are on the rise and we see more and more incidences of impatient and intolerant relatives of the patients attacking the treating doctors. We have witnessed mob attacks on doctors, nurses and paramedical staff during covid pandemic recently. In a way doctors are no less than soldiers on the forefront at such times. Fight with the communicable disease is another challenge for the medical personel in this situation. But the most hurting part is the violence from the benificiaries. The Kolkata case has created awareness about the issue of violence against doctors. Goa Government has taken some important decisions to safeguard the interest of Doctors working in different places, government hospitals as well as private hospitals. Let us congratulate and thank our Govt. for this. Proper arrangements for retiring during duty hours for interns, junior and senior residents - especially female doctors should be a matter of prime concern. These doctors are made to work continuously for 36 to 48 hours which is inhuman. Let us wish that all these issues are looked into seriously after the Kolkata incident.

I will be heading the Indian Medical Association Goa Branch in the year 2025. I am representing IMA Ponda branch to take upon this task. My predecessors IMA Bicholim branch are doing a wonderful job. They have raised the bar so high that I am afraid we might not reach that high. But as IMA Ponda has always been on forefront in various community activities and all our members have shown unity in whatever activities we have done so far in last 50 years, I am confident that we will prove ourselves. As IMA Ponda Charitable Trust is already in the field of Palliative care, we wish to make it our theme this year. So our theme this year will be "PALLIATIVE CARE" and the theme sentence will be -CARE WITH COMPASSION THAT'S PALLIATION. Palliative care is an approach that improves the quality of patient's life suffering from life threatening illness and their families through the prevention and relief of suffering by means of early identification and impeccable assessment and treatment of pain and other physical, psychosocial and spiritual problems.

This branch of medicine was started by Dr. Dame Cicily Saunders who started the first Hospice – St. Christopher's Hospice in London in 1967. Dame Cicily was a thrice qualified professional, having practiced as a nurse, social worker and doctor. The motto of palliative care is "add life to years and not years to life". As a human being has right to live with dignity, he or she has right to die with dignity. A person with chronic life threatening disease like Cancer, Chronic Kidney Disease, last stages of COPD and various such ailments is shunned by community and sometimes dies a neglected death. Why should the exit from this world should be so painful? can't we give him a respectable and peaceful farewell? IMA Ponda Charitable Trust through its palliative care project "DILASA" is trying to do this work since 2019.

During our tenure we intend to raise awareness about Palliative care in general public as well as medical community. This will be done with the help of family physicians and volunteers. It needs a team approach to provide palliative care. The team includes Palliative physician, nurse, a medical social worker and sometimes, a clinical psychologist or counsellor. The care provided along with possible cure will make the patient comfortable. This care need not be only at the end of one's life, but in case of diseases like cancer, it starts right at diagnosis. To reveal the diagnosis to the patient or his relatives needs special communicating skill. Our vision is to make the people aware about how we all can make a chronically ill patient's life comfortable and happy with our treatment and compassionate behavior. I feel that medicine is incomplete without practicing palliative medicine. In our initial years of general practice we as physicians had to surrender to the illness in its terminal stages but now after learning and practicing palliative medicine we are learning to help the dying patient to take exit peacefully. The sense of fulfilment for us and gratitude in the eyes of the departing soul makes us complete doctor. We request all members of IMA Goa to help us in this humanitarian task. IMA Ponda Charitable Trust is the 2nd IMA branch starting a Palliative care center after the Erode branch.

So we wish that IMA Goa spreads this message throughout the state. It is said that the only certain thing in life is death and let us make it dignified.

Press Conference to brief Media about Protest March of 17 August 2024



In response to the brutal molestation and murder of a postgraduate student from RJ KAR Medical College Kolkata, IMA Goa State as per the directives of IMA HQ declared a State level shutdown of OPD services from 6a.m. Saturday 17/08/24 to 6a.m. Sunday 18/08/2024. In response to call given by IMA Goa State almost 200 doctors assembled at Azad maidan. State IMA President Dr Sandesh Chodankar while addressing the crowd put forth various demands including the justice to bereaved family with immediate arrest of the culprits, strict stringent law for violence against the Doctors and

declaration of the hospitals as the safe zones.

IIMA Bicholim President Dr Shekhar Salkar and Hon MLA Bicholim Dr Chandrakant Shetye also spoke apt to the occasion. Further on all the doctors proceeded to Old GMC complex with a silent march wearing the black armbands. The rally concluded with speeches and expressions from IMA members and other association The members from the various members. associations like Indian Dental Association. Dental private doctors, Nursing, Pharmacy, Ayurveda, Physiotherapy, Chemist druggist, Medical representatives association, women NGO Bailancho sad, Inner wheel Club also joined and actively participated in the rally

IMA GOA STATE MEETING WITH HON CM DR PRAMOD SAWANT

Shortly after that IMA delegation comprising of IMA Goa State President

Dr Sandesh Chodankar, Hon Secretary Dr. Rajashree Marathe, IMA Bicholim President Dr Shekhar Salkar, MLA Bicholim Dr Chandrakant Shetye associate member of Ima Bicholim and Dr. Vishwanath Marathe Member of Ima Bicholim met Hon CM Dr. Pramod Sawant at Sankhali and explained him about the purpose of today's protest and OPD shutdown across Goa. It was also informed to him that we are sympathetic towards patient care and any medical emergency management will not suffer.

Hon CM promised to get back to us on a positive note. IMA Goa State submitted a memorandum to Hon CM demanding amendments in Present Medicare personal Act 2013, fast tracking of cases of violence against doctors, setting up a district task force for an immediate action on violence against doctors, sensitization of law enforcing agency regarding safety of healthcare workers and the most important to review the medical facilities across Goa with respect to safety and security of women at workplace.

- Sensitization of law enforcement agencies on medical legal jurisprudence and safety of medical professionals.
- Provisions to fast-track cases of violence and crimes against medical professionals.
- Enact a dedicated bill for violence against medical professionals and impart impunity to healthcare workers.
- District level Special task force under the Police department for handling crimes and violence against medical professionals in state of Goa.

We with support of all medical associations of the state of Goa request you to kindly consider our demands and help us serve the medical needs of citizens of the state.

A meeting was conveyed by Hon CM Dr.PramodSawant on the request of IMA Goa State to discuss the various issues faced by Health care professionals in Goa at Gazetted police officers institute Altinho, Panjim on 27/08/2024.

Hon Health minister, DGP, IGP, Chief Secretary, IMA Goa State President, Dean GMC, Director DHS,MS both district hospitals.and the GARD President, all SP and DySP were a part of this meeting. IMA Goa State President welcomed the gathering followed by the presentation by GARD President wherein he displayed the mid night real time pictures of places of concern at Goa Medical College.



He further requested higher authorities to give protection by armed personnel in sensitive areas of GMC. Request for starting Code Violet in GMC, provide walkie talkie to security and appointment of a DRO (Doctors response officer) who will inform MS and Dean and Outpost Police Station, CCTV coverage of all the lonely areas of GMC, provide lady security guard to female doctors while attending calls in IPHB.TB/CD, Implementing visitors pass was also demanded.



On behalf of IMA Chairperson IMA medicolegal cell Dr Shailesh Kamat gave a detailed presentation on Doctor police relationship for better healthcare. He addressed the issues in existing Medicare act, quackery, POCSO and CEA. Some of the demands put forward by IMA were to make amendments in existing Goa Medicare act, strict action against quackery, ordinance for extension of date for permanent registration and amendments in CEA. Hon MLA Dr Chandrakant Shetye spoke on Sop for police to handle the violence against the doctors. Meeting was finally addressed by Hon CM and HM and following demands were accepted

- 1) Ordinance for extension of date for registration by Ganesh Chaturthi
- 2) Changes in Clinical establishment act by 15th Sept 2024
- 3) Suitable amendments in Medicare act 2013
- 4) Awareness to police inspector and pink force about Quackery/ POCSO / MTP by Ima goa state
- 5) Code system in GMC about violence. CM has asked police to study GMC infrastructure and keep an armed personnel and ASI/PSI grade police officer in GMC.

IGP Shri Omvir Singh has agreed for the same. CM also assured the doctors in private sectors of protection from Govt by sensitization of police stations in their vicinity All in all meeting ended on a very fruitful note with a very interactive participation by all. Also present on the occasion was







WORLD ORS DAY 29TH JULY 2024
